Keynote address by Marijo Kent-First, Dr. Hanlon's former graduate student

Dr. Hanlon was **one of the first two women** to graduate from the University of Minnesota School of **Veterinary Medicine** with a DVM in 1952. She remained at the University of Minnesota as an Instructor while she pursued a Master's degree and attained her **Board Certification in Veterinary Radiology**. In 1963, Dr. Hanlon was hired as the **first female tenure-track professor** in the University of Minnesota's School of Veterinary Medicine. She advanced in rank to full professor, teaching a wide variety of classes to both undergraduate and graduate students.

In 1969, Dr. Hanlon became the first female **Diplomate in the American College of Veterinary Radiology** and served as Secretary and later President of the American Veterinary Radiology Society. She was also elected the **U.S. Representative** of the **International Veterinary Radiology Association** and was also the **Program Chairwoman** for the International Meeting in 1973. Dr. Hanlon's primary **research interests** were in developing the **diagnostic and therapeutic capabilities of radiology** for veterinary medicine. She is also widely noted for her **pioneering research in hip dysplasia**. Her booklet "Canine Hip Dysplasia" was widely noted and was well-received nationally and internationally.

Dr. Hanlon retired from teaching in 1985. In 1992, she received the **School of Veterinary Medicine's Distinguished Service Award** and in 2006, **Veterinarian of the Year Award**, based largely on her hard work towards establishing the official **Minnesota Veterinary Historical Museum**. Dr. Hanlon **remains active** in her volunteer work with the Red Cross, the University of Minnesota and the Minnesota Veterinary Historical Museum.
